## **Comparing health inequality in men and women: prospective ...**

The greatest relative inequalities were seen for alcohol- and drug-related mortality in both men and women , with the magnitude of these associations being greater in men. However, circulatory diseases and cancers had the greatest age-standardized mortality rates and showed the largest absolute inequalities (indicated by the SII<sub>s</sub>) in cause-specific mortality (Figure 4).

## **Inequalities in all-cause and cause-specific mortality ...**

Between ages 50 and 75 there was no significant change in inequality in mortality, but after age 75, mortality inequality increased significantly among males. It is also striking that for adult men between 20 and 34, there was virtually no improvement in mortality rates between 2000 and 2010.

The RII was greatest at young ages, for both sexes. Time trends showed steadily significant increases for RII in both men and women (estimated annual percentage change (EAPC)men=3.8; EAPCwomen=2.6).
